

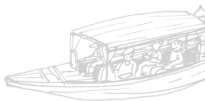

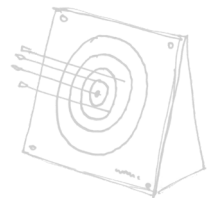






Discover the Uniqueness of Local Wisdom and Thai Herbs

Nakhon Nayok – Prachin Buri

Enjoy adventurous activities amidst the mountains, take a boat and observe the local life along the river, or learn about herbs and the local wisdom through fun workshops. These nearby destinations are full of surprises and are far more special than you would ever have imagined.





Challenging Adventure in the Barracks' Fence

Chulachomklao Royal Military Academy



This military education institution lies in the embrace of Khao Cha-ngok and covers the wild jungle area of up to 30.4 square kilometres. The military school has become the tourist attraction with its exciting adventure activities so the public can understand more about the military academy. Fun and challenging activities that are offered to groups of family, friends, and organisation employees include:





The CRMA Museum

The Museum was established in remembrance of King Chulachomklao (also known as King Chulalongkorn or King Rama V the Great) who founded this military school. Inside the building, there is a video presentation of how the school was established, as well as exhibitions of the military regimental colours, weaponry, and various uniforms of the Royal Thai Army ranging from the reign of King Rama V the Great to the present. Visitors can be fascinated by the exhibition of renowned alumni and war heroes, and explore the exhibition on King Rama V the Great, which features a life-sized resin sculpture of King Rama V the Great, and his personal items; such as, table and chair set, bookshelf, and working table.





Chaopho Khun Dan Shrine

Visit a sacred shrine that is highly revered by the local people who usually come to pay homage and make a wish that their children pass the entrance exam to the Military Academy. According to legend, Chaopho Khun Dan successfully drove out the Khmer troops from Nakhon Nayok during the war between Siam and Burma in the reign of King Naresuan the Great.



Ice-breaking Sports Activities

The activities are aimed at creating happiness and teamwork through different bases; such as, making a campfire, conquering Khao Cha-ngok, eco-trekking, ‘plant seeds shooting’ to return richness to the jungle and the watershed forest, and games that challenge you to solve problems as a team.



Experience Military Activities

Have a chance to participate in abseiling down the cliff, jumping off the tower, and test your shooting accuracy at the shooting range. You can also learn how to use a gun for self-defence purposes from a professional trainer, who will be providing every step of the way. Depending on your style and how you like it, you can choose different kinds of guns; such as, magazine pistol, revolver, and .22 long rifle.

Adventure Activities

Visitors can practise concentration and accuracy with exciting activities; such as, BB Gun shooting, paintball, archery, cork gun shooting, dart throwing, kayaking, zip-lining over the stream, cycling, driving an all-terrain vehicle (ATV), or even playing golf in a very challenging golf course.

The Meeting Point of
Organic Agriculture Enthusiasts

Saphan Thung Na Mui

(Thung Na Mui Bridge)



Only a few hours drive from Bangkok takes visitors to smell the grass, soil, and hay, while walking along an s-shaped wooden bridge painted in brown that is winding and making a beautiful contrast with the green colour of the large paddy field. The atmosphere changes depending on the agricultural season, in which some months, the paddy fields are painted with violet and green colours from riceberry ears, whereas some other months, visitors will get to see the fields becoming bright yellow because from Sunn hemp during the soil improvement period. Such changes are the natural beauty of the organic agricultural way of life that 'Ot' or Chaimongkhon Khaonin, the owner of Saphan Thung Na Mui wanted it to be.





With a Firm Vision

As the Saphan Thung Na Mui has become more and more famous, there are more channels for agricultural exports. It formed a group of villagers called 'Thung Na Mui Organic Farm' to carry on his initial intention, establish an organic ecosystem, and use the Saphan Thung Na Mui to bridge local villagers with tourists from other places. Upon arrival, a small but cute market welcomes everyone with booths selling organic products from local farms, and

passing on happiness and good health to tourists through such products as bilimbi, tamarind, santol, various kinds of local vegetables, coconut ice-cream, mulberry juice, and Yanang lotion. There is a coffee shop and a restaurant of which country music will be the mantra that pampers visitors that are walking on the bridge and buying local products. They will not only be healthy, but also fall in love with the countryside more and more.

Tracking the Route of "Reeds": Local Wisdom
from the Paddy Fields of Ban Bang Phluang

Ban Bang Phluang Reed Mat Community Enterprise



Behind the curtain of green and tall reed plants in the field is a group of villagers constantly bending up and down to cut the reeds, while another group could be seen tossing the reed to separate them according to their size, and the other group is sitting comfortably while tying the reeds and grouping them. These are the daily activities of the villagers at 'Ban Bang Phluang' community in Amphoe Ban Sang in Prachin Buri province that is closely connected to 'reeds', the important local resource. Even though this community is small, it is a large reed mat producer of Thailand.





When Reeds in the Paddy Fields Become a Beautiful Mat



"Reed"

Reed is a kind of weed with a round and hollow trunk. It grows in wetlands and can grow very quickly. People make use of reeds by weaving them into mats and rope.



In the past, rice farming was the main occupation of the Ban Bang Phluang villagers. Since there was a large amount of one species of reeds known as ‘krachut’ (saltmarsh bulrush) growing in the paddy fields around the community, the villagers would weave the krachut into mats for their own use and also sold them to earn extra income. Reed mat weaving then became the key local wisdom that was passed on from generation to generation. The uniqueness of the reed mats here is that they are made from long strips of reeds that are sticky and cannot be easily broken, and using nylon threads to secure the reeds together so the mat looks smooth and beautiful. The longer it is used, the tighter the mat becomes.



Turning Crisis into Opportunity

Weaving reed mats has continuously helped villagers to earn extra income, but things changed when the area was heavily flooded for several years and they could no longer cultivate and sell rice, and reed mat was not what the market wanted. The community brainstormed ideas to solve the problem and formed the ‘Ban Bang Phluang Reed Mat Community Enterprise’ to transform normal reed mats into special ones with different functions;

such as, mats, pillows, sandals, bags, luggage with wheels, lamps, and a multifunction box set. The villagers also combine the Thai identity; for example, silk, sarong, and Thai loincloth known as ‘Pha Khao Ma’, with the modern designs, and they were awarded a gold medal in the competition of cultural products from the Ministry of Culture in 2016. Eventually the products of this community have been internationally exported.



Today, the people at Ban Bang Phluang have a complete range of services in producing a reed mat as this has become their major occupation. There is systematic division of labour in the Community Enterprise, ranging from a group who grow the reeds to a group that turns the reeds into strips, a group to weave the reeds into mats, and a group that transforms the reed mats into other products. The community, moreover, has collaborated with the municipal office to organise a project of cultural tourism that enables visitors to experience Prachin Buri in another different dimension. It is not only that they can buy reed mat products, but they can also learn how to weave them and explore the local ways of living and enjoy a boat trip along the Prachin Buri River.

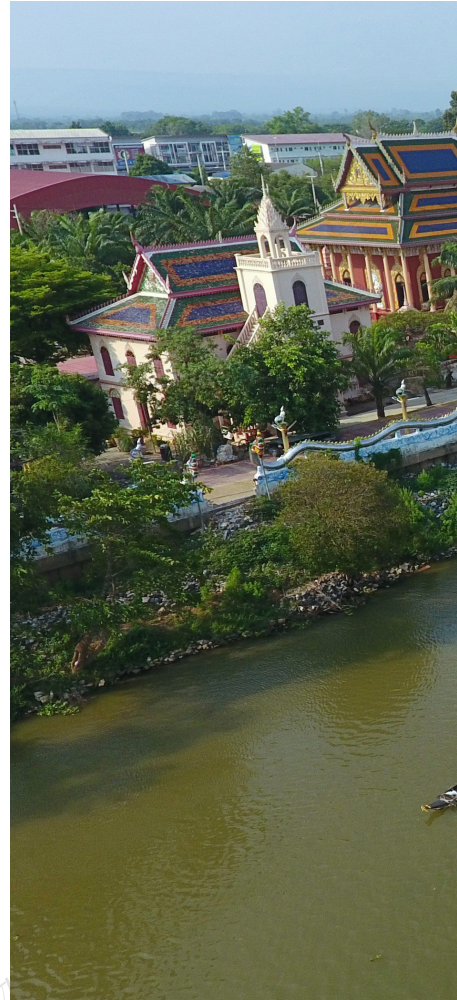

Wat Kaeo Phichit



Chaomae Thapthim Shrine

Get on an ancient wooden boat at Wat Kaeo Pichit Pier and enjoy the cozy ambience and cool breeze on the cruise that dances along with the riverine rhythm. Observe the local fisherman's way of life on both sides of the Prachin Buri River, while listening to the local tour guide telling historic tales of this very river. Enjoy delicious Thai dessert as the boat cruises along the river passing important spots; such as, **Sawang Bamphen Thammathathan Foundation**, which was the first rescue team in Prachin Buri, and the **Prachin Buri City Pillar Shrine**.



You can get off the boat to visit the **Chaomae Thapthim Shrine** before getting back on the cruise and continuing the journey passing several beautiful ancient temples; namely, **Wat Luang Prichakun** and **Wat Thewabut**. Witness thousands of fruit bats flying all over the places before stopping the boat, so you can float the lotus in the river, pay homage to the seated Buddha image, the reclining Buddha image, and the standing Buddha image that are housed at Wat Bot. Finally, get off the boat either at the **Ban Bang Phluang Arts and Cultural Conservation Community Enterprise Pier** or at **Aroonsawad Riverview Resort**, before taking a car ride to the Ban Bang Phluang Reed Mat Community Enterprise.

Remark: For this historic route, visitors can also drive along the road that runs parallel with the Prachin Buri River instead of getting on the boat, so they can drop by at the different tourist attractions aforementioned themselves.

Participate in the reed mat production workshop

and enjoy shopping for reed mat products

Learn how to weave a mat, a basket, a coaster, and make your own decoupage bag from the villagers who will give step-by-step advice to visitors. If visitors visit the village at the reed harvesting time, they will be invited to participate in the culture of reed farming with the villagers. Before returning home, purchase the souvenir from over 100 items of reed mat products to help distribute income to the community.

The Landmarks of Thai Herbs

Bhumi Bhubejhr

Herbal Wisdom Park



The topography that consists of mountains, forests, and rivers enables Prachin Buri to be blessed with biological diversity that is rich with flora and fauna, particularly the herbal plants that are used as medical treatment. This local wisdom has long been passed on from generation to generation until the present. Prachin Buri has therefore been dubbed as ‘The Herbal City’, where its expertise lies in the knowledge of growing, researching, developing technological know-how, producing herbal products, and providing medical services. Moreover, Prachin Buri is becoming a popular health tourism destination.





Bhumi Bhubejhr Herbal Wisdom Park at Bang Decha is another project organised by the Chao Phya Abhaibhubejhr Hospital. This has become a new landmark for visitors to come and learn about Thai medical wisdom and Thai herbs, so they can be self-sufficient and earn income from the herbs around them.

The area of 48,000 square metres in Bhumi Bhubejhr comprises ‘Ruean Mo Phloi’ (Doctor Phloi’s House), a 2-storey wooden building that is over 100 years old. The owner of this building was Mo Phloi (Doctor Phloi), also known as ‘Muen Chamnan Phaetthaya’, who was a royal doctor in the reign of King Rama V the Great and King Rama VI. Ruean Mo Phloi is the model of a hygienic house that was built based on the concept of ‘Ruean Pen Ya’ (the house is a medicine). The second storey is a museum that tells the biography of Mo Phloi and the story of Thai doctors in the past. Local medical equipment, various kinds of medicine grinder, and ancient pharmacopoeia are also on display.







Fun Workshop about Thai Herbs

The first storey of Ruean Mo Phloi is a spacious activity area where fun workshops are organised. Participants can learn how to make herbal inhalant based on the life elements of different individuals, herbal compress, fragrances, and Thai perfume made of local herbs. Visitors can choose whatever kind of fragrance they like with the help from the local experts who are more than happy to explain about the characteristics of the different herbs. Visitors can also explore the largest jar centre in Thailand, as well as the garden by the pool that grows various kinds of herbs grown in different plots categorised according to the kinds of symptoms.

Traditional Thai Medicine, Storage of Herbs,
and a Classic Building

Chao Phya Abhaibhubejhr Hospital



This provincial hospital has successfully mixed traditional Thai medicine with modern medicine, and has continued the herbal development project for more than 30 years. The project has covered all dimensions; such as, providing health service, spa service, and medicine, as well as processing herbs into medical supplies and cosmetics, and offering a restaurant for health. This hospital has been developed into a medical tourism attraction, which is accessible for everyone, to promote Prachin Buri as the Herbal City to a wider public.





From the first moment the car enters the front gate of the hospital, the elegance of the yellowish building in a classical European architecture becomes visible. The patterns of the stucco and fretwork at the arched doors and windows illustrate the delicate artworks; such as, palm pots, leaves, flowers, and seashells. Showcasing timeless beauty and historical value, this building is named after the owner whose name is ‘Chaophraya Abhaibhubejhr’ (Chum Aphaiyawong), who was the governor of the Khmer province of Battambang but was loyal to the land of Siam.

Abhaibhubejhr Building

(Abhaibhubejhr Thai Herbal Medicine Museum)

Chaophraya Abhaibhubejhr was the last governor of the Khmer province of Battambang, which always had a good relationship with Siam since the era of Ayutthaya. Later, this area of Battambang was ceded to the French, resulting in the exodus of Chaophraya Abhaibhubejhr, his family, and nearly 1,000 of his entourage to the city of Prachin Buri. Later, this building was constructed to welcome King Chulachomkloa (King Rama V the Great) and King Vajiravudh (King Rama VI), as well as many other members of the royal family, before it was handed to the government to be used as a hospital for public.







Today, this classic building, which is over 100 years old, is used as a Thai herbal medicine museum and is open to the public. The exhibition section tells the tales of the last governor of Battambang, including the family tree that traces back to the first generation of the line. Cardio tonic medicine, ancient palm leaf manuscripts on medicine, and tools for herbal medicine production are on display. There is also a pharmacy named ‘Thai Pho Ngoen’, which showcases ancient medicine cupboards storing a variety of herbs. The history and the development of the folk medicine in Prachin Buri is also presented here.



Beautiful and Romantic Garden

Behind the building is the **Abhaibhubejhr Herb Garden**, wherein the atmosphere is suitable for sitting and relaxing under the shades of various kinds of herbal trees; such as, hibiscus that is used to nourish hair, reduce blood pressure, and eliminate acne and skin rash; globe amaranth that helps to reduce vaginal discharge; bougainvillea that helps nourish blood; Indian borage, which helps fight against a cold and chronic cough and was also Chaophraya Abhaibhubejhr's favourite kind of herb, and over 300 more herbal species. In this garden, visitors will get a chance to see exotic herbs very closely.

Abhaibhubejhr Day Spa

At another corner of this hospital is a sweet minty-green building in the European style. This is the place where the local wisdom of traditional Thai medicine is collected and combined with Western civilisation to become a premium spa that offers relaxation in every dimension to the visitors. From the very first step, visitors will smell the aromatic scent that fills the room that is decorated in a classical style. Easy-listening music is softly played, creating a warm and romantic atmosphere.





There are various menus for health and beauty service; for example, traditional Thai massage, foot massage, aromatherapy massage, hair spa, detox, as well as body wrap and body scrub using natural herbs. The services can be done in accordance with individual life elements ('Pitta' is 'fire', 'Vata' is 'air', and 'Kapha' is 'earth' or 'water') to directly and correctly restructure your health and body.

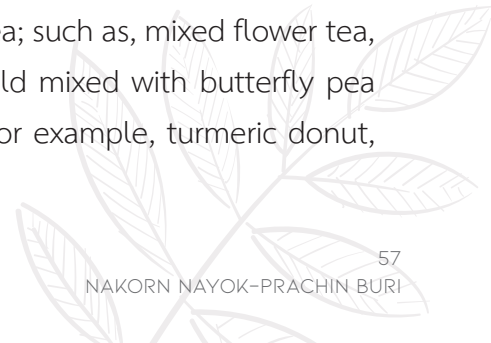


Abhaibhubejhr Spa Cuisine

Within the area of the Abhaibhubejhr Day Spa, visitors can enjoy food and drink that is good for your health. No MSG is used as the slogan of the place is “food is medicine”. Various dishes are made of herbs that are selected depending on individual life. For example, ‘Pitta’ element is suitable with the bitter, astringent and plain taste; such as, Kaeng Chuet Bacho Bai Hu Suea (minced pork and Indian borage leaf clear soup), Yam Baibuabok (centella leaves spicy salad), Yam Dok Khae (vegetable hummingbird spicy salad), and Mara Phat Khai (stir-fried bitter gourd with eggs).



Moreover, the beverage menu covers a range of herbal tea; such as, mixed flower tea, amomum biflorum jack tea, tea made of African marigold mixed with butterfly pea and pandan, roselle latte, and corn milk. Desserts are, for example, turmeric donut, brown rice waffle, and pumpkin waffle.





Shopping for Thai Herbs



Those who are interested in the processed natural herbs products can find more than 160 items of products that have been created and developed by a team of experts at the Abhaibhubejhr Herbal Shop. Examples of the products include rice bran oil that reduces the chance of heart disease and boosts the blood circulation, toothpaste, roll-on deodorant, sunscreen lotion, toner, facial skincare products made of Phak Bia Yai (purslane) and barbed grass that helps boosting collagen production for smooth skin, or even shampoo for dogs. All products are not too expensive and safety is also guaranteed.

The Tales from under Our Roof
and Our Shades of Trees

'Ban Lao Reung' : The Herbal City, Prachin Buri



The green colour of local herbal plants, the shades of thick-leaved jambu trees and banyan trees, and the long carpet of grass that extends towards a two-storey white wooden house by the Prachin Buri River, all combines to create a peaceful and warm ambience to visitors. This is a perfect place where local people of the City of Herbs gather, and tell the story of natural medicine to the younger generation, people in the community, as well as tourists who pay a visit here.



Forms, Tastes, Smells, and Sounds

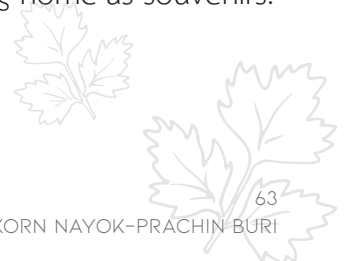
Originally, this small wooden house used to belong to the ‘Piamsombun’ Family before it was handed over to ‘Chaophraya Abhaibhubejhr Hospital Foundation’ for public use. The house keeps historical narratives, identity, and the character of

Prachin Buri in various dimensions, and shares them through different kinds of experience, including forms, tastes, smells, and sounds, using “herbs” as the conveyor of the message.



Herbal Gardens

Surrounding the house are the gardens full of herbs, with name tags and medicinal properties. For example, coleus helps relieve nausea; cordyline helps with fever, cold, and ulcer; and Eleutherine americana Merr. is used to relieve blocked nose, get rid of gas in intestines, and promote diuresis. The gardens are also used for activities that remind everyone of the importance of herbs; such as, a workshop to make food, drinks, and herbal products like soap, shampoo, herbal medicine, and artwork to bring home as souvenirs.





Exhibition Section

The exhibition presents historical narratives of Prachin Buri in a visual form. Antiques from the ancient era of Dvaravati; such as, ancient clay pots, earthen jars for betel, and celadons are on display. Biography of important figures in Thai history and the abundance of this Herbal City are also presented. The ways of life of the Prachin Buri people are shed upon in the ‘Way of Life Library’. Visitors will also get to explore the ethnic diversity in Prachin Buri in which Thai, Lao, Phuan, Vietnamese, Khmer and Chinese are intermingling in this very land.





The Restaurant

The highlight of Ban Lao Reung is the exotic cuisine and beverages that are made of herbs; such as, Rat Na Sen Anchan (noodle made of butterfly pea in gravy). Its purple noodle from butterfly pea helps nourish your eyes and your brains while the gravy is made of tapioca and arrowroot flour that helps revive intestinal cell. Also, Nam Phrik Ong Lae Phak Kiang (Northern Thai meat and tomato spicy dip with vegetables on the side) is Lanna cuisine where the tomatoes and dried chilis are full of vitamin A that help nourish your eyes, skin and hair. The recommended herbal beverages include butterfly pea juice mixed with soda, the three-musketeer soda, and three-comrade soda. The waiters will be explaining the benefits of each menu while serving, which helps enrich the atmosphere of the meal and makes every dish even more tasty.

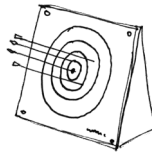

Discover the Uniqueness of Local Wisdom and Thai Herbs, Nakhon Nayok – Prachin Buri

DAY 1



Morning:

Learn about the history of the school and enjoy many challenging activities at the **Chulachomklao Royal Military Academy**.

Afternoon:

Admire the beauty of the paddy fields while strolling along the boardwalk that extends over 150 metres at **Saphan Thung Na Mui**.

Afternoon – Evening:

Get on the ancient wooden boat at **Wat Kaeo Phichit Pier** and cruise along the river passing many attractions. Disembark the boat and visit the **Ban Bang Phluang Reed Mat Community Enterprise** and learn the reed mat weaving process and enjoy a DIY reed mat weaving activity and buying souvenirs.



DAY 2

Morning:

Enjoy fun workshops; such as, making inhalants based on the individual life elements or making a herbal compress at the **Bhumi Bhubejhr Herbal Wisdom Park**.

Late Morning:

Visit **Chao Phya Abhaibhubejhr Hospital** and explore the Chao Praya Abhaibhubejhr Building, which serves as the museum of traditional Thai medicine with the Thai Pho Ngoen Pharmacy selling a variety of herbal medicines.

Lunch:

Taste delicious food and beverages with herbal ingredients where the waiters explain about the medicinal properties of each menu at **Ban Lao Reung**.

Afternoon:

Stop by to purchase various seasonal fruits at the **Nong Cha-om Fruit Market**.
