THE PARADISE ISLAND FOR LOVERS

>> The romantic atmosphere of Ko Samet has brought many lovers together and some say whoever goes to Samet will fall completely in love with it. With an area of about 5 km², it is not so big that you feel lonely, nor so small that you feel suffocated. Samet is truly a romantic island - the perfect place to surrender to love.



From the humble fishing village on the island's northern shore, Samet now has a wide variety of basic and up-market accommodation around much of its coastline. It is a destination with a friendly welcome for all LGBTQ couples, especially at Sai Kaew Beach, Ao Phai and Tubtim Beach.

RAYONG

The natural beauty and charm of Ko Samet have never faded, and still draw crowds, as they always have. What has improved on Samet are the accommodation and shops, and better roads that take lovers to every bay conveniently. • Best time to go for a romantic holiday: All year round, with the best weather being from October to April. The romantic spots to view the sunset are at Ao Kio Nai, Ao Phrao and Laem Ruea Taek.

Cetting to Ko Samet: take a 40-minute ferry from Ban Phe, or hop on your accommodation's speedboat, which takes around 15 minutes. To get around on the island, take a pick-up taxi or rent a motorcycle. For more information, visit www.samedresorts.com.

ADD SWEETNESS WITH FRUITS

>> One thing that makes visitors from around the world fall in love with Thailand is the tropical fruits and their sweet, sour and juicy tastes. The Eastern region, especially Rayong, is one of the renowned orchard areas. Every year, from summer to rainy season, about 30 orchards join together in welcoming visitors to enjoy their all-you-can-eat fruit buffet, at prices around 400-600 Baht per person.

Orchards in Rayong can also be fun to visit; some have developed into full scale agro-tourism operations, while others still use traditional methods and captivate visitors with their timeless charm.



Visiting Rayong is definitely a full, fun and informative trip.

• Best time to go savouring a fruit buffet: During fruit season, from April to July.

 Nok Krajib, a must-eat native durian variety. Their taste is phenomenal.

DESIGN YOUR LOVE USING BATIK

>> This community enterprise is one of the area's great destinations for lovers. You can learn how to design and make your own tie-dye clothing, and also shop for colourful matching tops for you and your sweetheart.

The community started making batik fabric in 2008, before turning to making tie-dyed items in the last five years. Natural substances such as indigo and mangosteen peel are used to dye the fabrics, and other techniques such as screen printing and hand painting are also employed to enhance the patterns. Visitors can join a one-hour workshop on making tie-dyed T-shirts and create their very own tie-dyed tops to take home. A special pattern of your own design can be prepared in advance so it can be screen printed onto your garment. Many couples choose heart patterns to tell the world that they are in love.

• Best time for making your own tie-dyed garment: Open every day from 8.00 am - 7.00 pm for shopping and viewing production process. A workshop session requires advanced booking.

ROMANTIC TRIP TO PRIMEVAL PEAT SWAMP FOREST

>> Just five minutes on a raft will transport you to the midst of an enchanting peat swamp forest. The sights and sounds of the outside world fall away as you enter the eerie stillness under the trees. The only movements are of the indigenous birds - cormorants, Asian openbill storks and teals - that turn their heads left and right in tree tops and glide silently above the water.

Rayong's wetlands are the most fertile in the Eastern region, covering an area of more than 1,200 acres. Nature tours by boat, on foot or by bike are a major attraction for visitors, with the boat trip being the best way to see how the local flora, such as the salt-tolerant paperbark trees and the floating grass islands, has evolved to thrive in this marginal environment.

Drift peacefully with your sweetheart along the waterways of this lush ecosystem and forget the hustle and bustle of city life. The ancient wetland forest has stood the test of time because it adjusts to changes and challenges, just like a loving couple's fondness for each other. • Best time for a boat trip: Late morning or evening to avoid strong sunlight; mid-year during rainy season when there is plenty of water.

DON'T MISS

• A boat trip to Khi Pla Island; five hundred metres from Hat Mae Phim Beach. It is a small, uninhabited island with unique beauty.

RELEASE CRABS WITH YOUR LOVE IN THE MANGROVE

The suspension bridge above Ta Boi Canal demonstrates the locals' love for their neighbourhood and its natural resources. Their concern for the endangered mangrove crabs that live nearby gave birth to their mangrove crab conservation project, for which they received a grant from the private sector to build Raksamae Bridge and a walking trail through the mangroves, so that visitors can enjoy and learn about more than a hundred species of native fauna and flora.

The success of the conservation project has led to another adorable activity, mangrove crab weddings! Around St Valentine's Day, 'brides and grooms' (young mangrove crabs) are taken from different areas. A fleet of boats forms the Khan Mak procession and takes the young crabs to their 'crab condo'. The three-day festival is filled with plenty of other activities, too.

The idea of crab conservation has developed to link romantic love with a love for nature; lovers who release crabs here are seen as making merit together so they will always be together. They are also encouraged to cross the Raksamae Bridge together to ensure their love will be long lasting.

• Best time to release mangrove crabs and walk across Raksamae Bridge with your loved one: During high tide is best as it provides spectacular scenery, or around St Valentine's Day.

CHANTHABURI

ATTACH A LOVE PADLOCK ON THE MOST BEAUTIFUL ROAD

>> The sign at Noen Nang Phaya viewpoint reads "This hill is the place where lovers unite; couples who wish for long lasting love should make a vow of eternal love." This small hill on Chanthaburi's coast is the destination where sweethearts can fix a padlock to symbolise their love.

The road that leads to Noen Nang Phaya, Chaloem Burapha Chonlathit Road is a scenic route dubbed the most beautiful road in





Thailand. The road covers over a hundred kilometres from Chon Buri, through Rayong and Chanthaburi, to Trat.

The prettiest part, however, is undoubtedly where the road passes Nang Phya Hill, standing majestically between Khung Kraben and Khung Wiman Bays. The long hillslope sweeps up from the shore, with the coast road winding past at its foot, between the sea and the mountain.

• Best time to attach love padlock: when the sun sets into the sea.

ENHANCE YOUR LOVE LIFE WITH GIANT OYSTERS FROM THE EASTERN SEA

>> Being a seaside province, Chanthaburi certainly has plenty of great seafood to offer, especially the little known giant oysters.

Lung Thom (Uncle Thom) was a local fisherman before he started 'Pa Lui Lung Thom Oyster Farm'. After drawing the first tourists to his farm, he drew the attention of a research project supported by the Thailand Research Fund and a local university. A research team helped him to



study the oysters and inspired him to use the knowledge he gained create a successful agrotourism venture run by community members.

Pa Lui and Lung Thom farm has three types of oyster for visitors to try: Crassostrea belcheri and C.lugubris are large varieties of oyster the size of your palm; and a smaller variety. Saccostrea commercialis. A five-minute boat trip to a raft in the sea will give you a chance to learn some of the secrets of oyster farming and savour fresh oysters straight from the sea with traditional accompaniments - fried shallots, jumbay leaves, chili paste, and seafood dip. If you prefer lemon, take some along.

According to research,

oysters, which are rich in zinc, are not only nutritious but are also aphrodisiac. If you visit the farm with your sweetheart, don't be shy to try some!

• Best time to try oysters: Eat them during the day so you can test their properties at night!

FRESHEN UP IN A NATURAL JACUZZI

>> A broad stream babbles lazily along its rocky channel, cascading into pools hedged on both sides with lush greenery. Visitors easily become enchanted by this natural beauty and it comes as no surprise to learn that this beauty spot acts like a magnet, drawing tourists to Ban Thung Phen Community. In the past, locals earned their living from the fertile orchards, watered by the stream flowing off nearby Mount Khitchakut. Many still do, but visitors easily become enchanted by the natural beauty of the area, which draws throngs of tourists to the new homestay and

resort accommodation.

The community manages twenty guest rooms for tourists along the banks of the stream, thus providing an incentive for locals to keep the water clean and the area beautiful. Both day visitors and overnight guests are welcome to enjoy themselves in the 'natural jacuzzi', while taking in the views of the magnificent mountains all around.

• Best time to dip: Morning or late afternoon, during the rainy season the water flows quite strongly. In summer the cool water is especially refreshing.

WALKING WITH YOUR SWEETHEART ON PINK COAST

>> If the sweetness of love was a colour, it would surely be the soft, warm pink of the sandstone formations along the seashore in Khung Kraben Wildlife Reserve. Take a romantic walk together to enjoy the natural wonder that is unique to the Reserve.

The pinkish purple sandstone spreads like a huge field of rocks and boulders, some standing up like low cliffs. This coastal landform is not only good for taking fantastic photos but also makes your walk along the beach a little adventurous and challenging. The distance is not great, so it is perfect for lovers who want to have fun clambering along the shore without getting too tired.

The more energetic couples can follow a circular route, starting from the pink sandstone, along the beach, and then turning to climb the hillside and finish at Khao Bo Toei viewpoint. This is a superb spot to bathe in the warm, pink rays of the setting sun.

• Best time to walk on the rocks: Start around 4–5 pm to arrive in time for sunset at Khao Bo Toei viewpoint. For visitors who only want to walk on the sandstone, an umbrella or sunscreen is recommended. The pink colours of the landscape are at their best when the sun is bright.

DON'T MISS

• About 5 km from this point is Wat Pak Nam Khaem Nu, where the chapel is decorated with beautiful blue tiles.

COOK CHANTHABURI'S LOCAL DISHES TOGETHER

>> Rai Tam Farm Suk, a smallscale farm in Tambon Bang Kacha, has a shop that serves food and coffee to visitors to Wat Phlap, the old temple in the community. The farm also has a large reservoir and the Farm Suk Horse Riding School offers lessons to visitors.

Another pleasant activity is the cooking class. Khrua Farm Suk, the farm's restaurant, offers a class in cooking local Chanthaburi dishes, which are well-known for their exciting flavours. You and your loved one can learn to prepare some simple dishes using fresh, local ingredients and enjoy eating them together.

Strengthen your love and work up an appetite at Khrua Farm Suk preparing simple but delicious dishes with your sweetheart.

The farm kitchen places great importance on using the finest locally sourced ingredients to create favourites such as mangosteen spicy salad, which uses organic mangosteens from a nearby orchard. The focus on seasonal ingredients means that





you may be cooking dishes like sweet-and-sour salacca soup, spicy durian salad, or duck curry with longan, depending on when you visit.

• Best time for cooking classes: Before lunchtime or in the afternoon to avoid busy period.


• Toob Moh Market in Bang Kacha community each weekend. Near Wat Phlap, this is the place for plenty of scrumptious local treats.

SEARCH FOR GEMS OF LOVE

>> Chanthaburi is world renowned for its gemstones. It is said that the province was once so rich in gemstones that they would simply wash out of the soil when it rained. Even though the gem trading business in Chanthaburi is past its heyday, the province's expertise in cutting and polishing gems lives on.

In Thai folklore, gemstones symbolise different aspects of love. Rubies are for pure love and kindness, emeralds for eternal love, opals for love and hope, sapphires for true love and honesty and topaz for love and friendship. What better way



for lovers to reaffirm their love than to buy gems that embody their true feelings for one another?

Visit Bao Ploy Lek Phet Community Learning Centre where you can learn the traditional gemstone mining method from digging, sifting and spraying water to find precious stones at a real working mine. Try your hand at gemstone mining and then go shopping (or just window shopping) at the gemstone and jewellery centre in the city, where the gemstones are guaranteed to be of high quality.

Best time to acquire in-depth gemstone knowledge: Around mid-morning go to watch traditional gemstone mining method and enjoy panning for gemstones, then go shopping for beautiful gems in the afternoon.

DON'T MISS

• A Christian church in Chanthaburi houses a figure of the Virgin Mary decorated with gemstones. Take a quiet, romantic moment together in the cool interior to soak up the atmosphere.

DRIFTING AWAY IN A DUGOUT CANOE


>> Ban Salak Khok is a small fishing village tucked away on the east coast of Ko Chang. The fertile mangrove forest here is the island's largest. It is so romantic drifting through the forest in a dugout canoe, or 'ruea mat' in Thai. A fisherman wearing 'ngop', head gear made from bamboo and palm leaves, rows visitors through canals overhung with trees, ferns and other plants. It is a great way to admire the natural environment. The trip lasts about 40 minutes.

• Best time for ruea mat trip: Any time between 8.30 am and 4 pm but when the tide is high the scenery is more beautiful.

DON'T MISS

• The restaurant at the jetty serves fresh seafood bought straight from the fishermen.

Drift away at Ban Salak Khok: 250 Baht pp. Advance booking: Tel. 08 7748 9497



HAVE FUN SWIMMING WITH ELEPHANTS

>> To most people, Ko Chang, means white sandy beaches, clear blue seas and fresh seafood. But how about bathing with elephants next time you are there?

Ban Chang Thai, in Khlong Phrao village, is a small elephant camp that has been in business for more than ten years. The elephant camp does not put on a tourist show or train the animals to do anything that is not part of their natural behaviour; instead, the focus is on providing an opportunity for humans and elephants to learn from each other.

You can have plenty of fun bathing and splashing with the elephants. The natural swimming hole is a pond fed by a clear mountain stream. A bathing session lasts about half an hour and for those who cannot swim, life jackets are provided. Mahouts are present to supervise the activity. • Best time to go swimming with elephants: Rainy season is the best time to go because there is plenty of water.

CRUISE TO ANCIENT CANNONBALL MANGROVE

>> What makes the cruise at Tha Ranae village special is the unique vegetation in the area. The first part of the cruise takes you through an enchanting green tunnel created by dense mangrove forest and nipa palms that give cool shade along the canal, while the destination, dubbed 'the wonder of Trat's mangrove forests', is an old-growth cannonball mangrove. The intertwined roots of these trees are so beautiful and look like an abstract sculpture.





The canal was long used for transport and wood was collected to make charcoal until the Royal Forest Department launched a conservation project to manage the area. The community then developed the mangrove forest into a tourism destination. Their efforts have paid off, since the mangrove forest was declared Thailand's healthiest mangrove in 2013. The highlight of the cruise is at the Lan Tabun; a grove of cannonball mangrove trees, which are thought to be hundreds of years old. The forest here looks, and is, really primeval. Lovers can get off the boat, walk about on the huge tangled roots and pose for photos or enjoy the beautiful scene from

a swing that the villagers have built.

• Best time to visit Lan Tabun: In summer, between early March and May, the water level is low and suitable for viewing the root formations. You can call to inquire about the water level before planning your trip.

WALK HAND IN HAND TO WATCH THE SUNSET IN THE EASTERNMOST PROVINCE OF THAILAND


>> Capture a truly romantic moment to treasure always: pose for a photo together in an intimate embrace, while basking in the golden rays of the sunset. Trat, Thailand's easternmost province, is also the first to enjoy the splendour of the sunrise, and the province's clear air and fantastic coastal scenery make it especially breathtaking.

There are many spots where lovers can enjoy the last (or first) light of day, such as the easternmost strip of land at Laem Ngop pier, where the red and white lighthouse stands out among the natural scenery. This is also a great spot to enjoy a view of Ko Chang on the



southern horizon. You can admire the beach that stretches away to the edge of sight, the island's mountainous spine and the fishing boats are sailing out on the sea. The Kai Bae viewpoint on Ko Chang Island is another superb spot to enjoy an enchanting sunset, overlooking small islands scattered in the calm sea that sparkles golden just before the sun slowly disappears. To witness sunset from Thailand's very easternmost territory, you can also head to the exquisite island of Ko Kut, dubbed 'the Andaman of the East'.

• Best time for watching sunset with sweetheart: Every fine day. If you want to be there on time, check the sunset time of each day at the Thai Meteorological Department's website: www.tmd.go.th



DON'T MISS

Around 30 km from Ban Mai Rut (a half-hour drive) is the narrowest spit of land in Thailand. Be sure to take a few photos for a keepsake.

LEARN THE LOCAL WAY OF LIFE IN AN EASTERN FISHING VILLAGE

>> If your romantic getaway has time for more than just a brief stay at a beach resort, you can learn a bit about the charming local way of life at Amphoe Khlong Yai, an Eastern border district. The fishing village of Ban Mai Rut will surely give you a new perspective on life. This small village enjoys a great location; situated at an estuary beside a mangrove forest, and the canal is lined with the houses of the friendly fishermen, who greet you with smiling faces.

• Best time to visit: You can visit Ban Mai Rut all year round. If you go around late October or early November, you might have a chance to witness the stunning multi-coloured jellyfish phenomenon.





TRUE LOVE FOR NATURE, LOW-CARBON TOURISM

>> Many lovers travel to far-off Ko Mak, a tourist destination with such a unique character that most visitors find hard to leave. Part of the island's uniqueness is that it has its own charter a sign that shows the islanders' determination to manage sustainable tourism and preserve the key elements of the identity of Ko Mak: environment, peacefulness and amity. Accordingly, resorts and activities operate with respect for nature and the community.

Besides upholding the island's charter, the community members are keen to implement low carbon tourism strategies: reducing the use of plastic, waste management, and more.

• Best time to be on the island: November to April is the time when the sea is most beautiful and the weather at its best.

DON'T MISS

• The old house near Ko Mak Seafood Restaurant serves as a museum where historic items and the story of Ko Mak's origin are preserved and displayed.

There is a speedboat service from Laem Ngop pier to Ko Mak – about an hour's ride. There are only 6 round-trip boat services per day so advance booking is required; 900 Baht for 1 round-trip.







4 Days 3 Nights Eastern Romantic Routes



Leave the capital early in the morning and make a stop in Rayong to refuel and refresh with a food and fruit buffet and a stroll in the orchards. After you have had your fill, head to Raksamae Bridge to release crabs, before crossing the bridge with your sweetheart to ensure your love is long-lasting. Alternatively, take a boat trip to the ancient cannonball mangrove in the Rayong Botanical Garden, before heading to Chanthaburi in time to view the beautiful sunset from Noen Nang Phaya viewpoint.

Get up early to take a walk on the pink sandstone rockfields at Khung Kraben Wildlife Reserve, then head back to town for a local cuisine cooking session at Khrua Farm Suk. In the afternoon, visit a traditional gemstone mine at Bao Ploy Lek Phet and learn more about precious stones at Chanthaburi Gems & Jewellery Centre, or buy a piece of jewellery for your sweetheart.

DAY

Head to the easternmost province, Trat, and choose the island that suits your preference the most. If you enjoy a lively day with lots of activities, then go to Ko Chang pier. Those who enjoy the tranquility of a smaller island can head for Ko Mak pier. Spend the rest of the day and evening unwinding on the island of your choice.





There are air-conditioned buses and minibuses from Bangkok Bus Terminal (Chatuchak) and from Bangkok Bus Terminal (Ekamai) to the three eastern seaboard provinces.

Bangkok Airways operates direct flights from Bangkok to Trat.

> To travel around, there are air-conditioned minibuses from the bus terminal in each province.

Get up early feeling fresh and choose an activity you would like to try for another half day, or return to the mainland to do other activities, such as visiting Lan Tabun ancient mangrove forest before heading to Trat Airport for a safe flight back to Bangkok.

CHIANG RAI

GAZE AT THE SKY, COUNT THE STARS AND BE EMBRACED BY COOL MIST ON THE MOUNTAIN TOP

>> Amphoe Wiang Kaen, Thailand's easternmost district, rewards visitors with the astounding natural scenery of the mountain range that divides Thailand and Laos, especially at Phu Chi Dao, In winter, before dawn, tall grass bends in the crisp wind on the Phu Chi Dao ridge under the star-filled sky, before they flicker and fade in the first light of day. Spend the moment absorbing the magic of nature with your sweetheart on the 200-metre viewpoint at Phu Chi Dao and discover your tender love.

• Best time to declare your love on the mountain top: Winter, when skies are clearest, is probably the most romantic time. In the rainy season, there is a chance to see a fabulous sea of mist all around. Make sure to reach the entrance to Phu Chi Dao before 5.00 am, take a 15-minute ride on a pick-up truck (500 Baht) and then walk up the mountain for another 30 minutes. You should reach the top before 6.00 am – in time to see the star-filled sky before first light. (Summer visitors should arrive earlier.)



DON'T MISS

• Don't underestimate Phu Chi Dao during low season. In May, morning temperatures on top of Phu Chi Dao are in the low twenties Celsius. If you book accommodation and pick-up service in advance, you might be the only couple up there.

AROMATIC ROUTE TO COFFEE AND TEA PLANTATION





>> Chiang Rai is the home for tea and coffee in Thailand and a must-visit destination for travellers who are fond of a cuppa. Chiang Rai's plantations are also perfect for lovers; the province offers a variety of tea plantations with different characters.

You can choose a tea plantation in a remote and peaceful hill tribe village on Doi Mae Salong, where visitors can experience the local way of life and learn a part of Yunnan history and culture, or Doi Wawi, which is reminiscent of a rural Chinese village and is where Thailand's Oolong tea is produced. For a modern and well organised establishment, head to Choui Fong Tea Plantation. It is convenient to go there and not very far from the city of Chiang Rai.

For couples who prefer coffee, Chiang Rai is also the place where high quality coffee beans are produced. Villages on many mountains have turned to coffee farming and produce high quality coffee beans. Many of the coffee growing villages, such as Doi Chang, Pangkhon, Doi Pha Hi and Mae Chan Tai, also blend tourism with their coffee farming.

• Best time for a trip to tea/coffee plantations: For tea plantations, any time of the year is convenient. Best time to visit coffee plantations is from October to January, when coffee trees are bearing fruit.

PROVE YOUR LOVE IN THE TREETOPS

>> The Mae Fah Luang Garden on Doi Tung is the work of Doi Tung Development Project, and is known for its beautiful cool-climate plants. Recently, the Garden organised an adventurous 'Treetop Walk' along a 300-metre rope bridge which is 30 metres above the ground! Visitors get to know the variety of flora in the Garden as they walk along the shady bridge and enjoy an easy zipline with full safety precautions and well-trained staff.

The activity is suitable for couples with children aged between 8 and 12.



• Best time to walk in treetops: Any time of the year. A Treetop Walk after 4.00 pm is less hot (last walk is at 5.00 pm).

MAKE SA PAPER POSTCARD WITH YOUR SWEETHEART

VISIT THE PLACE THAT COMMEMORATES THE GREAT LOVE OF HUMANITY

>> When the twelve young members of 'Wild Boars' football team and their coach became trapped in Tham Luang-Khun Nam Nang Non Forest Park in 2018, this sleepy backwoods place suddenly achieved international fame due to the arduous nature of the rescue mission. After the incident, the forest park in which the cave is situated received



improvement grants to help it meets international standards for tourism.

The cave itself is not yet open but visitors can visit a museum dedicated to the heroes involved in the rescue mission. It displays many pieces of art created by Chiang Rai's local artists related to the mission that has brought love and co-operation from all over the world to this remote place. It is also the site for Sergeant Sam's statue.



ALL-YEAR ROMANTIC ACTIVITIES AT SINGHA PARK

>> Lovers who enjoy fun activities in a romantic environment will love Singha Park for its range of exciting things to do throughout the year. Besides the beautiful vistas of colourful flowers and lush green trees, you can also enjoy the international balloon festival held each February, along with the love song concert and local cultural performances.

A trolley tour is a good way to see what is going on in the huge farm without having to spend much energy. For a more physical option, you can cycle around (rent a bike or bring your own).

LOVE ON KWAN PHAYAO

>> Kwan Phayao is a must-visit destination for lovers who come to Phayao. It is the biggest freshwater lake in the northern region. This vast lake in the middle of Phayao town was a catchment for water from nearby mountains and was used for irrigation and fish farming until 1939, when the Department of Fisheries built a sluice gate to keep more water in the lake, leading to the inundation of nearby communities and temples.

Wat Tilok Aram was one of the temples affected. It was rediscovered by a local fisherman in 1983, and subsequently became a local attraction. Lovers who come to Kwan Phayao usually take a boat out onto the lake to visit the temple.

• Best time to take a rowboat trip: Avoid hot sunny period by going in



the morning or late afternoon (not later than 5.00 pm).

Fee for a rowboat: 30 Baht per person, or 150 baht to rent a whole boat (seats 5 passengers).

DON'T MISS

San Pa Muang village, on the edge of Kwan Phayao, is famous for good quality handbags made from water hyacinth. They come in many designs and are popular export products. Tel. 08 1672 8037, 08 1602 7771

MESMERISED BY THE HEAVENLY SCENERY

>> Sipping a cup of coffee with your sweetheart beside you, at a viewpoint overlooking a huge limestone mountain standing cloaked



in morning mist and surrounded by green fields is such a romantic moment. The limestone mountain is in Tham Sa Koen National Park in Nan Province. The viewpoint at Phu Langka Ban Suan, with its nearby shops, has been a popular spot to view the heavenly scenery and has turned Phu Langka into one of the must-go destinations in Nan.

• Best time to sip coffee while enjoying the fantastic scenery: At dawn in the rainy season or in winter the scenery is at its best. For scaling Phu Langka, only winter is suitable.

SEE SYMBOL OF LOVE AT DOI PHU NANG

Peacocks are used as a symbol for many good things in Chinese belief, while Hindus believe that the peacock represents love. Isn't that a good reason to go to Phu Nang National Park in Phayao, to be wowed by stunning scenery and watch peacocks roaming there? Phu Nang has the highest peacock population in Thailand and is home to the last flock of Thai peacocks (or green peacocks). There is also an exhibition building that gives information about Thai peacocks.

The National Park is rich with natural attractions, such as Than Sawan Waterfall, which has water all year round. • Best time to go to watch peacocks: During mating season, between November and March. There is a better chance of spotting them in the morning or evening.

MAKE A ONE-OF-A-KIND CERAMIC TOGETHER


>> Ceramic figurines and utensils of all sizes and shapes fill the shelves of Huenpatima Ceramics, some pieces as small as the tip of your little finger. Huenpatima Ceramics is a small ceramic factory open for visitors to shop for souvenirs or join a ceramic-making workshop for a small fee. The one of a kind ceramic piece that you and your sweetheart have made will be sent to you by postal service.

• Best time to make a ceramic together: Any day but booking is required 2 days in advance.

>> Inside the timber Vihara built in Tai Yai architectural style is a golden Buddha image that worshippers come to pay homage to regularly. Take a close look at the carved golden teak panel behind the Buddha image (you will need to use binoculars or the zoom on your camera for this purpose) and you will see a cupid figure appear on the panel. It is believed that the cupid is a British influence, since the temple was built with the influence of many cultures.


The Cupid at Wat Nantaram is the reason why many lovers come to ask for blessings and make merit together. Best time to ask for a blessing: All day, before the Vihara is closed.

REVEAL YOUR LOVE IN FRONT OF PU MAN, YA MAN

>> The image of a couple whispering to each other forms part of the mural inside the chapel of Wat Phumin is a famous picture called 'Pu Man, Ya Man' (Grandpa Man and Grandma Man) or 'whispering lovers'. The mural is the work of Nan Bua Phan, a renowned local artist of Tai Lue descent, and is regarded as one of the nation's masterpieces.

Being an ancient temple with intricate murals in the heart of Nan City, Wat Phumin draws lovers to ask for everlasting love by walking anticlockwise - through an arch under the two nagas in front of the chapel - 3 times and then ask for a blessing from 'Pu Man, Ya Man'.

• Best time to walk through the arches: Go during the day, especially on weekends when there are local



guides to provide information inside the chapel. It is less crowded in the evening, just before the chapel is closed.

DON'T MISS

• Buying a replica one-baht note used during the reign of King Rama VII, on which the chapel of Wat Phumin is featured. Original one-baht notes are also available.





MAKE MERIT TOGETHER BY MAKING A MAH TAO LANTERN FOR A TEMPLE



>> Mah Tao lanterns are part of Nan's Buddhist cultural heritage, but non-Buddhist couples can still enjoy making a Mah Tao lantern and at the same time learn a local craft. Head to Muang Tuet village for this hands-on traditional craft experience. You can donate your finished lantern to a local temple, or take it home to use as a decorative souvenir.

• Best time to make a lantern: Any day, but appointment is required. For those who wish to offer the lantern to a temple, the morning session is better so that the finished lantern can be offered to the temple in the afternoon.

>> Get to know the plant that is the source of the world's favourite sweet, learn how rich chocolate is made at Cocoa Valley and get some to take back home, too.

Cocoa Valley's founders began with a love of cocoa, the desire to create job opportunities for the rural people and an ambition to make quality Thai cocoa well-known. Cocoa Valley offers more than just somewhere for visitors to stay and a café where its products can be enjoyed; it runs an informative workshop that starts with a tour of the cacao plantation and then gives hands-on experience making chocolate, which participants can take back home. It is a wonderful activity for couples who love chocolate.

• Best time to attend the workshop: All year round but in the rainy season and in winter, the weather is less hot and there is a high chance to see the cacao fruit.

ROADS OF ROMANCE NAN'S SKY ROADS

>> Nan is known for its many mountaintop roads - or 'sky roads' - such as the road from Amphoe Pua-Bo Kluea to Chaloem Phra Kiat. Take route 1256 for about 40 km: the road gradually winds higher and higher up the mountain, with scenic terrain on both sides. More breathtaking scenery can be found along route 1081, from Bo Kluea to Chaloem Phra Kiat (the road from Amphoe Tha Wang Pha to Amphoe Chiang Kham in Phayao.) Route 1148 is dubbed 'Romantic Road' by the Tourism Authority of Thailand. Winding along mountain ridges, the road gives you a magical feeling of travelling through clouds high up in the sky, with tiny maize farms and villages dotted far below.

• Best time for a road trip: Best views are during rainy season and winter. Be extra careful on rainy days because the roads are steep and winding.

CAMP OUT, COUNT THE STARS AND ADMIRE THE SEA OF CLOUDS AT DOI SAMOE DAO

>> Doi Samoe Dao is always on the list of romantic destinations in Nan. This small mountain in Si Nan National Park is popular with visitors, since its big camping site allows campers to experience three magical natural phenomena in one place; watching the sun set behind the mountains, admiring the star-filled night sky and being enchanted by a sea of clouds in the morning.

Doi Samoe Dao is easy to reach by car, without extra trekking. Just book a tent with the National Park in advance and prepare your supplies.

• Best time to count the stars: The weather up on the mountain is best from October to February. Choose a night with little or no moon to see millions of stars. Weekdays will give you more privacy than weekends or long weekends, when there are lots of campers.



ENJOY YELLOW DUCK' PADDLE **BOATS OF NONG** PRACHAK

>> Previously known as Nong Na Kluea, the water park of Udon Thani, Nong Prachak Sinlapakhom Park was not an attraction until six years ago, when the Mayor had the idea of adding 'yellow ducks' to the water park. Ever since, Nong Prachak has been a magnet for fun-seekers. The idea was inspired by the yellow duck created by the Dutch artist, Florentijn Hofman. The yellow duck is consequently the symbol of Udon Thani and represents peace and unity.

A couple of years ago, yellow duck paddle boats were added to the water park. Lovers can enjoy riding one together.

>> Nong Han is a freshwater lake in Amphoe Kumphawapi that covers more than three thousand hectares. Contributing not only to the local ecosystem but also to the natural beauty of the area, Nong Han is famous for its red lotuses. When in bloom, the whole lake is covered with attractive, sweet, bright pink lotus flowers. Imagine you and your sweetheart rowing a boat on the lake, surrounded by thousands of lotus flowers. How spectacular it would be!

Nong Han is also home to a great variety of birds and is a local freshwater fishing area. You can spend a whole day on a boat trip there.

• Best time for a boat trip to see red lotus flowers: Lotus flowers are in full bloom from December to February. Make sure you go in the morning, lotus flowers are most beautiful before 11.00 am

PAINTING ANCIENT PATTERNS AT A WORLD HERITAGE SITE

>> Ban Chiang Archaeological Site is a famous world heritage site, considered the most important prehistoric site in Southeast Asia. While the site and its famous pottery are exciting enough, lovers may find painting the Ban Chiang designs even more fun.

At the cultural activity mall are shops and an open space for



visitors who want to paint the ancient decorative motifs on small pottery jars, starting from the simple spiral pattern which is the trademark of Ban Chiang pottery. It takes less than an hour to paint the Ban Chiang pattern - or any other pattern you prefer - and wrap it up, ready to take home.

• Best time to paint Ban Chiang pottery: Every day, during weekends and long weekends there are more shops open and the mall is livelier.

LOVE IN FLOWER-NURSERIES OF BAN HUAI SAMRAN

>> Ban Huai Samran has long been the biggest flower growing area in Udon Thani but it was only last year that the village was developed to cater for agricultural tourism. Many kinds of flowers, such as chrysanthemum, marigold, cape gardenia, goldenrod and



jasmine are grown here. Enjoy a Tuk Tuk Skylab ride among the numerous flower fields in the village; there are also demonstration plots for a closer encounter and lots of beautiful spots for photo taking. It is such a pretty place for an excursion.

If you go there during off-season period, you might be able to ask a farmer to visit his/her plantation; they are willing to show you around.

O Best time to go for a stroll in the flower fields: Winter, from November to February, is when there are the most flowers blooming.

It is such fun riding along bumpy creek bed beside the mountain. through shady forest and fields to a waterfall in a village. Once you reach the village, an exotic tasty native meal served in bamboo tubes is ready, waiting for you.



The trip back is through a leafy rubber plantation with charming rustic scenery.

• Best time to take an amphibious trip: Any time of the year, since the village is in a fertile watershed forest so there is always water in the creek. Make a trip in mid-morning and reach the village in time for lunch at the





They can be found waiting for patrons along roadsides, so grab one and let them show you the gothic-style Saint Anna Church, the old Governor's residence which is now an important museum, the yellow colonial-style Chaloem Phra Kiat Library and the Naga Monument.

Prices for a tour on Tuk Tuk Skylab are subject to the number of places to be visited and time taken.

• Best time to take a Tuk Tuk Skylab tour: During weekends, in the morning or evening for cooler weather and less traffic.





SPEND TIME TOGETHER ON A CRUISE ALONG THE MEKONG

>> Large double-deck vessels cruise along the Mekong in late afternoon, taking their passengers past riverside scenery; fishermen at work in the middle of the river and villagers of neighbouring Laos attending their daily chores.


ENJOY PHU THAI CULTURE AND FESTIVAL

OLD-TIME LIFE ALONG CANALS

An old community on Khlong Bang Luang (Khlong Bangkok Yai) reflects the life of a bygone era with its old timber houses along both sides of the canal. There is an artist's house called Ban Silapin, which once belonged to an old goldsmith's family. Here artists meet, artwork is put on exhibition,


OVERNIGHT BOAT TRIP ALONG THE RIVER OF TIME

>> Travelling to Ayutthaya by road or rail is quite common, due to its proximity to Bangkok. There is another, more leisurely and romantic, way to get there, though; by taking an overnight boat trip up the Chao Phraya River. The old junks that ply this route are refurbished and motorised and provide a comfortable service, with the added bonus of impressive views along the way and stops to visit temples and places of interest.

It is the only means of transport that allows you to experience the way of life along the river, as you cruise slowly back through time from the present capital to its predecessor.

TOURING THE OLD CAPITAL'S HISTORICAL SITES BY BIKE

>> One way that lovers can get a close look at this UNESCO World Heritage City is by renting bicycles. Ayutthaya is perfect for touring by bike, and with the help of a map, you can have fun and easily get to all the sites, spending as much time as you want at each one. You can contact local Tourism Authority Office before taking the trip. Bike rental shops can be found at the railway station, Tourist Police Office, and at accommodation in the city. 50-70 Baht for a whole day.

• Best time to go cycling: It takes a whole day to see the city; plan the afternoon trip well, with some temple visits where you can take a break from the burning sun.

DON'T MISS

• Bike beyond the city's island to Wat Phra Ngam Khlong Sa Bua to see the 'door of time'. This is the roots of an ancient Bodhi (fig) tree that have grown onto the temple's wall. Be there around 4–5 pm and wait for the sunlight to shine magically through the door.



TAKE SELFIES IN TRADITIONAL THAI COSTUME

>> Among the photos you take in Ayutthaya, you should have one or two selfies of the two of you in traditional Thai costume. It is not a problem to find those costumes: just head to Wat Chaiwatthanaram. one of the old temples with spectacular architecture. There are shops in front of the temple renting out Thai costumes and accessories. on a daily rate, meaning you can wear the costume and go to take photos anywhere.

 Best time to take photos in traditional Thai costume: Any day but choose a fine day so you can get good shots.

SHOP AT FLOATING MARKET AND ENJOY SUMPTUOUS CENTRAL THAI DISHES

>> Ayutthaya was once a major Asian trading port and the floating market reflects the importance of the river that brought foreign traders to the city. Unfortunately, the original floating market has long gone but there is a new, lively floating market called Ayodhya Floating Market, where you can





find more than 200 shops along waterways, with vendors dressed in traditional Thai clothing. Besides the delicious food selected from every district in Ayutthaya, there are souvenirs and cultural shows as well.

• Best time to go shopping at floating market: Mid-morning on weekends; the food is still fresh and there are fewer tourists at this time.

• A boat trip around the floating market is also available for 30 Baht, the market opens every day, from 9.00 am to 7.00 pm




• Best Time to enjoy homestay: Boarding and activities can be done all year round, but especially in the rainy season when the countryside is a lush green.

ASK FOR BLESSING AT CHAO MAE SOI DOK MAK JOSS HOUSE

Smoke from the incense that worshippers use for paying homage to Chao Mae Soi Dok Mak fills a red Chinese joss house. According to historical records, the story of Chao Mae Soi Dok Mak happened long before Ayutthaya was the capital. Chao Mae Soi Dok Mak was a daughter of a Chinese King, sent to marry a Siamese King. Once her entourage reached Ayodhya, there was a tragic misunderstanding between her and the Siamese King, causing her to commit suicide. Her body was cremated at the place where Wat Phanan Choeng still stands today. Since her story reflects true love, local young people usually come to her shrine for blessing.

• Best time to visit Chao Mae Soi Dok Mak joss house: Every day.

The joss house is located in Wat Phanan Choeng, Tambon Khlong Suan Phlu, Amphoe Phra Nakhon Si Ayutthaya.











> There is a minivan service from Bangkok Bus Terminal (Chatuchak)

Take a train from Bangkok Railway Station (Hua Lamphong)

> You can also take a boat from Bangkok to Ayutthaya. Prices vary from company to company. Choose one that suits your budget.

For greatest convenience and flexibility, rent a car at the airport from a reputable company (advanced online booking is recommended). Bicycles are also available for rent at most accommodation and at tourist destinations.

Start the trip at Trimurti Shrine with a blessing for long lasting love, before taking BTS to Saphan Taksin Station to view street art in Charoen Krung area. Then take a boat trip to Khlong Bang Luang to enjoy traditional canal lifestyle and watch a Thai puppet performance. In the evening, take an onsen bath before having an extravagant rooftop dinner while enjoying the views of Bangkok at night. Start the day with a cooking class. After enjoying the lunch that you have cooked, head to Erawan Museum to view the precious displays. Then head back to Ploenchit Rd for a relaxing spa, before taking a Tuk Tuk ride to see Rattanakosin Island. End the day with a romantic dinner on a cruise along the Chao Phraya River, or take in Bangkok's night skyline from the top of Mahanakhon Building.

Go to the old capital, rent a bike and use a map to plan your sight-seeing trip around the World Heritage City. Stop for lunch at Ayodhya Floating Market, before continuing the expedition. Once you reach Wat Chaiwatthanaram, don't miss the opportunity to take selfies of you and your sweetheart in traditional Thai costume in the vintage atmosphere.
